

## Canadian CIC Qualification Requirements

Qualifications are horse and rider in combination for uncategorized riders and are horse only for riders categorized at the specified level or above.

	FEI - D Riders	NF Requirements	Minimum of 1 MERs (not necessarily as a combination) at 2 CNC 2*s (Intermediate) horse trials.
	FEI – A or B or C Riders	NF Requirements	Horse – 1 MER at a CNC, CIC or CCI 1*
<b>CIC3*</b>	Uncategorized or FEI – C or D Riders	Two CCI2*s <b>Or</b> Two CIC2*s	Minimum of 1 MERs (not necessarily as a combination) at 1 CNC 3*s (Advanced) horse trials.
	FEI – A or B Riders	One CCI2* <b>Or</b> One CIC2*s	Minimum of 1 MERs (not necessarily as a combination) at 1 CNC 3*s (Advanced) horse trials.

- When multiple MER are required for CIs and CIOs, one of the MERs can be achieved incurring 20 penalty points at obstacles of the cross country test.
- For Championships and Games (CHs including the NAJYCs) all MERs must include zero jumping penalties cross country
- Where a MER at a CIC is required, a MER at a CCI of the same level is equally acceptable. (providing the MER result complies with FEI validity period for the competition).
